1 Call to Order

Chair Shannon Rose called the meeting to order at 7:01 PM. A quorum was met.

2 Welcome & Introductions

Acknowledgement of Local Indigenous Community

3 Special Guests: Deputy Superintendent and Acting Secretary Treasurer Nathan Ngieng and Trustee Rupi Kanda-Rajwan

Deputy Superintendent and Acting Secretary Treasurer Nathan Ngieng shared updates on the district's secondary schools, restating mission of preparing students for lifelong success through innovative, individualized education. The district includes five secondary schools, two middle/secondary schools, an alternative school, and an online school.

Key goals include improving literacy and numeracy for Grades 9–12 and supporting student well-being through engagement, belonging, and mental health initiatives. While some assessment results have declined, staff are working to re-engage students and boost outcomes.

Successes include community-based engagement, programs like IB at Abbotsford Senior and the School of Business and Science at Hansen, and improved transitions via UFV partnerships. Communication with families is maintained through newsletters, events, and social media.

Indigenous initiatives such as the Family Gathering, Elders Teas, and Indigenous Role Model Ceremony celebrate student achievements. The district will continue promoting student voice, expanding passion-based learning, and measuring well-being through the Youth Development Instrument survey.



4 Q&A with Special Guests: Deputy Superintendent and Acting Secretary Treasurer Nathan Ngieng and Trustee Rupi Kanda-Rajwan

4.1 Online booking for Parent Teacher Interviews

A concern was raised about the lack of an online parent-teacher appointment booking system, saying that it previously existed at their school but was discontinued. The current process requires parents to email multiple teachers individually, often resulting in time-consuming back-and-forth communication, which was described as inefficient and a barrier to parent engagement. Deputy Superintendent and Acting Secretary Treasurer Ngieng acknowledged the issue and said he would investigate streamlining the process. Other members mentioned that their schools do still offer online booking.

4.2 Evening appointments for Parent Teacher Interviews

Another concern was raised about the absence of evening appointment options at some schools, making it difficult for working parents to meet with teachers. Ngieng responded that this would also be taken back for consideration.

8 Question Period

8.1 Food Vendors

At both high schools and middle schools, what are the most popular food vendors during lunch times? One popular vendor mentioned was J's Pizza.

8.2 Low Parent Participation

A PAC member shared that during their school's AGM, there was very low participation—only one or two parents showed interest, and those parents were new to the country. Most current members are leaving, and there is concern that if no one steps up, the PAC will not meet the minimum requirement to apply for the Gaming Grant next year.

The response is that it's essential to have at least three people for signing authority. The group was advised to send an email to the entire school community, explaining what is at stake, such as the loss of Gaming Grant funds, the absence of a hot lunch program, and other PAC-supported activities. Clearly outline the impact if positions aren't filled by the end of the year.

- Have principal help to communicate the urgency.
- Recruit again before first PAC meeting in September.
- Reach out to elementary feeder schools and ask them to post information on their Facebook pages.
- Identify the PAC chairs at feeder schools and invite them to your AGM. If they have a child registered at your school for the upcoming year, they are eligible to take on a PAC position.
